L.C. Greenwood has not only been the honorary chairman for the past five years for this event, he has helped the American Respiratory Alliance with other community affairs, educational and fundraising events.

Limited to only 300 guests, the evening is a semi-formal affair that provides each guest with an opportunity for one-on-one conversation with the players. Tickets and tables are still available. Last year the event generated over \$100,000 for the American Respiratory Alliance, an organization that has utilized the power of the popular Steelers franchise to increase community awareness about lung disease for decades.
